5. 2024 FAI General Conference and CASI Meetings Report by CIAM President, Antonis Papadopoulos.

The 118th FAI Annual General Conference was held at Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in November 2024.

The meeting was well organised with many attendees and many good discussions. The budget was approved, and the election of the FAI Executive Board was performed. The former president David Monks finally did not stand up, and Greg Principato was elected as new FAI President. Four (4) new members are now on the EB.

It was decided to keep the suspension of Russia and Belarus and for the first time the application of a new member was rejected (North Korea).

The FAI Secretary General informed that the budget was discussed and accepted explaining all the relevant details. The FAI financial situation is now stabilized and the available cash in the bank, is a clear indication. The Commissions special reserves are now available for investments..

It was announced that the EB is looking to revise the current FAI members structure.

Compliment to CIAM were given for the visible and respective activity performed, in particular for the Drone racing management.

The CASI Plenary meeting took place as well. CASI is composed of 22 members. 11 representatives from the Commissions and 11 from the NACs. Elections have been performed: Antonis Papadopoulos was elected as CASI President and Bruno Delor as CASI Vice-President. A new version of the FAI Sporting Code General Section will be available from January 2025 and also during the year a new Jury Guidelines volume will be published. Bruno and Antonis made a well-accepted presentation about the e-drone events organisation. They will attract more young people with beneficial side effects also on the other sport commissions.

Mrs Francesca Doppel from IOC was present at the e-drone event in Saudi Arabia. IOC announced the first e-Sports Olympic Games for 2025. From FAI edrones and virtual Gliding submitted bids to be part of this new OG edition.

Antonis thanked Markus and all the FAI staff for the excellent support they provide to CASI and CIAM.

During a World Cup event, it is suggested that the Jury President has to follow the instructions as described in the FAI website and in the CASI Jury handbook. Some of the World Cup results needed to be adjusted due to the situation of the sporting license validity.

Competition Officials related matters

9. Jury performance at FAI World and Continental Championships.

9.1. Appeals

CIAM received complaints from Germany and Switzerland regarding Jury decisions for F4CH World Championships in Romania. The Bureau handled them and decided to accept both of them. This decision has as consequence the change of the results. The F4 Subcommittee chairman suggested to organise a seminar for the managing properly the Scale championships. The CIAM President reminded the seminar about how to manage complaints and protests.

10. Judges' performance at FAI World and Continental Championships

10.1. Judges' analysis

There was an issue about the F3CN European Championships in Denmark with few competitors. One judge was not evaluating the performance properly due to lack of experience. The CIAM President suggested to introduce tools for evaluation of the judges status.

For F3A, the RC Aerobatic Subcommittee Chairman, said than in every CAT1 event the scoring method used (TBL) is taking care of these things. Also the scoring systems used provide a detailed analysis of the judges performance. It is also a fact that nowadays it is very difficult to find experienced judges as it used to be in the past.

Drones Matters

19. 2024 Drones World Championship in China

Mr Delor reported that the event was very successful with a lot of invested money and impressive development activity. There were 110 competitors with 40% of juniors and 3 Chinese wild cards. There were severe technical problems due to the interference on the video due to the metallic parts of the gates.

20. 2025 World Drone Soccer Championship Bid

It is an interesting team class event very difficult to organise and develop. The bid was launched two months ago, and bids were offered by China and USA.

21. E-Drone World Cup

5 World Cup events were organised with 150 competitors in total. Last world cup was in Saudi Arabia. New countries, never involved before like India, participated. This category has high potentiality to attract competitors not strictly connected with FAI.

22. E-sports Olympic Games

Next year Saudi Arabia expects to organize the 1st E-sports Olympic Games and FAI already submitted a bid for e-drones and virtual gliding. The flying model is the same for all competitors. The EOG may be held every two years. The final decision from IOC is expected to be announced early in 2025.

23. Any other

There are some issues relevant to UAV rules implemented around the world that are affecting our activity. It is important to be in touch with the organizations that are taking care of this matter like what happened in the past.

24. Judges' education and qualification – Possible use of a tool

25. Section 4 – Sporting Code renumbering and format

The Technical Secretary informed that activity will be done for:

- Managing addendum
- Alignment of the different formats
- Color use
- Move table of amendments at the end

The FAI Secretary General informed that an investment will be done for defining a proper documentation management system.

26. Class to be retired

The class F3H and F3Q should be retired. For Aerostat there are no competitions at all.

27. Online registration for CIAM CAT1 events

This E-Navigator system is now working and it is used for specific FAI events. CIAM Bureau will decide in April if this could be used for all CIAM events.

28. Jury and Judges panel composition for CAT2 events – Review and conclusion

The general rules are not so restrictive like for CIAM. After discussion, it was decided to leave the rules as they stand.

The problem is the age of the Judges and how many are available per country. It is suggested to perform a workshop for judges for CAT 1 events.

It will be a proposal to discuss at the next Bureau meeting and after at the Plenary Meeting. Trainings for new judges could be done during the Championships.

29. Bulletin – 0 Template Review and Conclusion

The Bulletin 0 template was reviewed. The timeline from Bulletin 0 to Bulletin 1 can be described and the Space Subcommittee Chairman proposed to write this timeline with the support of the CIAM Secretary.

30. CIAM forms update

31. CIAM web pages update

CIAM President mentioned that still there are web pages prepared a long time ago that are not reflecting the current situation. The S/C chairmen will check and report during the next Bureau meeting.

32. CIAM Bureau future meetings format

After discussion, it was agreed to continue to hold those meeting in person.

The CIAM President showed the presentation which summarises the members survey.

33. Automated timing for CIAM events

A working group will be established, and the Technical Secretary will manage it involving the electronic matter experts. There are already suggestions for F1 and F5. An improvement could be to make the timing visible on site and to the public.

The CIAM President informed that the amount of 10.000 CHF is already approved with the budget and can be used for this project.

Activities

34. Status of official classes with championships with no events

The rule approved last year is now in place and there are now provisions in place for the official and provisional classes. Already F3 Soaring S/C chairman Mr. Bartovsky mentioned two provisional classes with almost zero international activity that can retired. F3H and F3Q.

35. Education S/C - Rookie Project

The CIAM President informed that only CIAM is having in place a dedicated education S/C. He asked a presentation about what done till now and FAI can support the CIAM Education subcommittee chairman.

5 Scholarship nominations have been submitted from Poland, Germany, USA, Netherlands and UK.

36. Meet with the Champions – On line presentations

The CIAM President proposed to make various session for Pylon, Aerobatic, Electrical, etc. Mrs Faustine Carrera from FAI can manage the introductions. Mr Lazarkov proposed Igor Burger as good promoter of F2 Aerobatics. Proposals from the Subcommittee Chairmen are expected by the end of the year.

37. IT Projects

The FAI AMS system will be extended for accepting the bids for the CAT 1 events, medals orders, etc. The FAI documents will be files in Cloud as well.

38. CIAM Legends medal review
